

Clothing

Long pants offer more protection than short pants. Layers of clothing are recommended so that the worker can adjust to the temperature. No loose jewelry please.

**Footwear** 



Good quality work boots are recommended, with a heavy, treaded sole that offers support, traction, and protection.



Light hikers and athletic shoes are acceptable. Duties performed may be determined by footwear.

**Equipment** 

Please bring work gloves. We will provide all tools, safety glasses, and hard hats. Those who

own tool belts may opt to bring their own.

**Age Limit** 

All volunteers on our construction site must be 18 years of age or older.

**Training**
